**PERMITTED TREES & MINIMUM
REQUIRED PARKING WIDTHS**

4 - 8 feet	American Hornbeam
4 - 8 feet	Amur Maple (treeform)
4 - 8 feet	Flowering Crabapple
4 - 8 feet	Flowering Dogwood
4 - 8 feet	Hedge Maple (treeform)
4 - 8 feet	Golden Chain Tree
4 - 8 feet	Japanese Tree Lilac
4 - 8 feet	Eastern Redbud
4 - 8 feet	Sourwood
4 - 8 feet	Japanese Maple

6 - 8 feet	Golden Rain Tree

PLEASE BE AWARE

- The following trees are **PROHIBITED** and no person shall plant any of the following species either in the public right-of-way or parking:
 - Box-Elder
 - Silver Maple
 - Sycamore
 - Elm Varieties
 - Willow Varieties
 - Poplar Varieties
 - Catalpa Varieties
-
- No tree may be planted where there is less than two (2) feet of soil on all sides of said tree; and no tree may be planted closer than five (5) feet from any hydrant nor closer than forty (40) feet to another tree on the parking.
-
- When **power lines are present** the following trees should be placed regardless of the parking width.
 - American Hornbeam
 - Amur Maple (treeform)
 - Flowering Crabapple
 - Flowering Dogwood
 - Hedge Maple (treeform)
 - Golden Chain Tree
 - Japanese Tree Lilac
 - Eastern Redbud
 - Sourwood
 - Japanese Maple
 - Persian Parrotia

DUTY TO TRIM & MAINTAIN

- It is the duty of the property owner or occupants of property to prune, maintain, and care for all trees, shrubs and bushes located upon the right-of-way or parking of the City and to ensure there is no visual obstruction onto street, alley, or other roadway.
 - **13' 6"** immediately above streets alleys or roadways.
 - **8'** immediately above sidewalks.
 - **2'** from sidewalk and of the curb line
