

It is the intention of the City Council that citizens be allowed to enjoy the use of Novelty and Consumer Fireworks in a manner that is in the best interest of the public's safety. Regulations are intended to prevent or limit injuries and/or fires caused by fireworks. We have highlighted some of the regulations to answer the most asked questions when it comes to shooting fireworks in the city.

A complete copy of the new Fireworks Ordinance is available at City Hall and includes regulations and permitting requirements related to the sale of fireworks. Contact Fire Chief Shaun Ryan if you are interested in selling them or have questions regarding the sale of fireworks.

You CAN shoot fireworks if you are:



Able to maintain a minimum distance of 150 feet from any structure or public right-of-way. For safety reasons, this does limit the use of fireworks to larger lots outside of the main residential area of town.

-AND-

On your own property or on property where consent has been given to you by the property owner.

You CAN NOT shoot fireworks if you are:



Less than 150' feet from a structure or public right-of-way In an area set aside for special events

Located in a Commercial and Industrial zone
Under the age of 18 unless you have direct supervision by a parent

Permitted Dates & Times to shoot fireworks:



Fireworks may be discharged on the following dates and times and only when in compliance with regulations.

Permitted Dates: July 1 - July 8 and again Dec. 26 - Jan. 3

Permitted Hours:9:00 am - 10:00 pm

Time is extended to 11:00 pm on July 4 and 12:30 am on Dec. 31)

Who assumes responsibility when discharging fireworks?



The person discharging fireworks assumes all responsibility for its operation and the consequences thereof. No person shall discharge fireworks in a reckless manner or when they are under the influence of alcohol, drug, or narcotics.

What type of Fireworks are NOT Permitted?



- Sky lantern open flame devices are not permitted within the city limits, except if tethered by a rope and under control by the person discharging it.
- Consumer Fireworks and Novelty items are NOT permitted in Special Event areas. (Novelty items include: Sparklers, Party Poppers, Snaps, Sky Lanterns, Paper Tanks, Ground Bloom Flowers, and Snakes)
- Pyrotechnic devices for professional use (including shells 3" or larger)


What type of Fireworks are Permitted?



"Consumer Fireworks" as defined by the State Fire Marshal. "Consumer Fireworks" are typically fireworks that are sold at authorized stands in the State of Iowa. Make sure you are purchasing your fireworks from a permitted retailer to avoid violating City Code. Contact the Fire Chief if you have purchased fireworks outside of Iowa as they may not comply with local laws.

Violating Fireworks Laws will result in costly fines. Please be safe as you celebrate this year. Remember to keep fireworks away from children and pets, read the instructions carefully, and be prepared in case of malfunction or fire. To report violations contact the Police Department.

Lead Service Line Inventory for Public Water Supply Systems

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Lead-Copper Rule Revision requires all community water suppliers and non-transient non-community water supplies to develop and submit a Lead Service Line Inventory to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (lowa DNR) by October 16, 2024.

The city will need to identify the type of service lines for ALL properties connected to the city's public water supply, regardless of ownership status. This does not mean service lines need to be replaced by the deadline, only identified. At a minimum, the city will need to determine if the service lines are classified as lead, galvanized requiring replacement, non-lead or unknown.

In an effort to better manage resources and costs, the city is asking for help from residents and business owners to self-identify their property's private service line material. As a result, a Lead Service Line Survey has been created to gather all required information. This survey is available on the front page of the City's website, www.westburlingtoniowa.gov, for residents to complete and submit online. For those residents that do not wish to complete the survey online, you may complete the aioining questionaire and return it to the city. Your service line material is either lead, galvanized steel, copper, or plastic/PEX. You can perform some tests on the private side of your service line to determine the material. One test is the scratch test. By scratching the private side of your service line with a quarter, where it comes into your home/business, you will be able to determine the material. You can also perform the magnet test by attempting to stick a magnet to the line. Read on to find out how to conduct these tests.



Avenue Trail Gear running from Highway 34 to Huston Street along the East side of the Mall inner ring road is under preliminary review with the State if Iowa (IDOT, IDNR) and is planned to go out for bid by the state in November. The bridge crossing will be increased to 10 feet and the trail extending to Huston Street will be at grade level but bounded on both sides by medians with and native, low trees maintenance vegetation and grass. The trail is expected to see heavy use and be a beautiful and functional additional to our community. Roughly 80% of the funding is from three outside grants!
